Dear Parents and Carers,

Next term, starting on 9th May 2024, the Year 4 children will begin their swimming lessons. Water safety is an important life skill and these lessons are a statutory part of the National Curriculum for physical education. In order to facilitate this, we are asking for a parental contribution of £60 to cover some of the cost of the transport to take the children to Farnham Leisure Centre. The school funds the actual swimming lessons and has made a substantial contribution towards the cost of the transport too.

Payment to be made via the SCOPAY online system. Payment can pay by instalments or in full but we would ask that a first payment of at least £6.00 is made by the 6th May with the total payment of £60 by the 15th July. We are not able to accept cash or cheques. In an effort to reduce paper, we have set up an online permission form on SCOPAY that you will need to complete before it will give you the payment option.

Your child will need the following equipment:

- Each child will need a bag containing a towel, swimming costume/trunks and goggles if required.
- If your child has long enough hair, it needs to be tied back (plaits can be ideal for swimming days).
- Earrings must be removed.

GIRLS - a one piece-swimsuit should be worn for the lessons – a bikini or a two-piece type costume is not permitted.

BOYS - swimming trunks or cycle type swimming shorts are ideal (shorts must be well above the knee). Bermuda style shorts that are below the knee are not permitted; shorts must not be baggy as these can be difficult to swim in.
